

The Local Offer



Transition 2


Transition 2, which refers to the transition of adolescents to adulthood (when education ceases), will be reviewed by the Local Authority following Transition 1.



Birtenshaw Supported Tenancies

Birtenshaw Supported Tenancies provide personal care and support to young adults with SEND. Birtenshaw provides a stable, caring environment in which young adults can develop their potential. A supported tenancy offers a high level of independence for the young adult within a safe, supervised environment supported by dedicated, experienced and well trained staff.

Supported Tenancies are a positive way of realising the potential of young adults through developing and strengthening life skills, including social and communication skills, and opening up opportunities for work or further education placements. We believe that through an individual and holistic approach, combined with robust policies and procedures, we can ensure positive outcomes are achieved by the adults we support. The goal is to ensure that all the adults are accessing community activities, increasing their independence and are enjoying their supported tenancy.

BuryEST

Employment Support and Training



Bury Employment Support and Training (Bury EST) is a Supported Employment Service offering advice, support and practical assistance to disadvantaged and disabled customers (who are eligible for funding) into employment, and meaningful activities such as independent living, independent travel, and life skills.

Working to an agreed development plan, Bury EST offer "packages" of support, tailored to individual needs, to move people forward to achieve desired outcomes. Bury EST customers working with our support are given the opportunity to try a variety of activities to increase their employability and independence skills.

Bury EST has vast experience (over 25 years) in the supported employment arena and has worked with local and national stakeholders and partner organisations to successfully deliver various supported employment projects.

Based at The Lodge House in Manchester Road Park, Bury and home to The Welly Community Café, we also work in partnership with employers, individuals and organisations to create a socially inclusive and diverse workforce.

To do this, we offer a range of services such as job clubs, employability courses work experiences and job trials. We work closely with employers to guide on tailoring their support and we also offer one-to-one support in work places until both employer and customer feel that working independently is possible.

Bolton Cares Supported Living

By providing a comprehensive range of personal and physical care packages, Supported Living helps maintain and protect an individual's independence and lifestyle. In addition to our care packages we also provide help with practical matters such as budgeting, cooking and developing social skills.

Our links with colleges, work placement schemes, community services and leisure facilities also open up new opportunities and provide further scope for the individual to develop their aims and ambitions. These services can either be accessed in our Supported Living accommodation or through our Outreach Services in your own home. Supported Living services are offered (but not limited to) people aged over 18, who have a wide range of care needs, including

- complex needs associated with mental illness
- complex physical health needs
- high levels of supervision
- management of behaviour that challenges.

Birtenshaw Enrichment Service

Enrichment is a modern, dynamic day support service for young adults with a range of special needs, including cognitive, physical and sensory impairment. The service is open all year round and staffed by fully trained and experienced individuals.

The service is designed to assist participants to live ordinary lives, doing things they want to do. Each person that attends has a personalised plan built around their hobbies, likes and interests. The personalised plan is developed by experienced staff completing an in-depth assessment with the participant and other professionals prior to admission to the service. This ensures an appropriate package of support is in place and bespoke to every individual. Regular reviews and updates of the support plans are completed.

Preparing for Adulthood Outcome: Friends, Relationships and Community

Birtenshaw Enrichment Service

The service itself is located at Firwood House, which is co-located with Birtenshaw College. There is a large open plan area, direct access onto a garden which the participants and staff maintain, use of outdoor cabins, an independent kitchen, sensory room, changing facilities and washrooms. There is also access to an onsite fully inclusive gym together with hydrotherapy pools located in Birtenshaw Bolton and Birtenshaw Merseyside Schools.

Participants have use of a fleet of Birtenshaw adapted vehicles to facilitate access the local community and day trips.



This wide range of facilities enables the creation of a person centred support experience for participants ensuring all their needs are taken into account including indoor activities such as cooking, crafts, discos and exercise.



The goal in Enrichment is to provide and facilitate not only a safe environment where are participants can have fun, enhance their social skills and engage with peers, but to promote and develop each participant's life skills.

Whilst out in the community participants can choose to access a range of activities such as bowling, cinema, trips to the beach or country parks. Local theatres or the zoo, the list is endless!

Whether it's arts and crafts, cooking or mountain climbing, we can make it happen!
